The “Proverbs 31 Woman” leads many women to despair and frustration. “I can never be or do all that she did!” I’ve actually heard women beg me NOT to ever preach on that woman! But there is a part of this woman that intrigues me...those invisible qualities that come from within her that impact many around her. What can we learn from her?

## I. Her Character

1. Strength
2. Honor is also part of her clothing.
3. Hope: “rejoices in things to come”
4. She is not idle

## II. Charm

1. Charm is a gracious, attractive spirit. It is generated from the inside out.
2. Her tongue is the law of kindness.

**1 Peter 3: 1** ¶ Wives, likewise, *be* submissive to your own husbands, that even if some do not obey the word, they, without a word, may be won by the conduct of their wives,

<sup>2</sup> when they observe your chaste conduct *accompanied* by fear.

<sup>3</sup> Do not let your adornment be *merely* outward -- arranging the hair, wearing gold, or putting on *fine* apparel --

<sup>4</sup> rather *let it be* the hidden person of the heart, with the incorruptible *beauty* of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is very precious in the sight of God.

**Galatians 5:** <sup>22</sup> But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness,

<sup>23</sup> gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law.
